Minutes from previous BRRP CLG meeting held on Wednesday 12 February 2014.

Linda Stewart speaking on behalf of Chris and Rob Evans: Requested clarification on the double glazing/soundproof glazing issue. Not acceptable for those closest to the park to suffer this hardship

Denis Preston (CCC): I spoke to Mark Christison about a contribution to the values of the acoustic fence equivalent. Further acoustic testing will be carried out as well.

Linda Stewart (Community Board): This needs to be addressed otherwise the BRRP CLG is rendered toothless.

Rob Pettit (resident): We are happy with the progress of the acoustic testing and work.

Rod Miller (BRRP CLG Chair): There was graffiti and I'd like to express our thanks for its removal and the removal of the orange posts. The Council needs to look at the scruffy entrances, especially at the Tumara park side.

Rob Wilson (BRRP): Park continues to processing increased volumes. Truck movements in December and January were down. Red zone work will mean an increase in volumes through BRRP.

Regular boundary testing means no particles or dust get outside or covering the local community areas.

Speeding is still an issue but that is more about driver habits than anything else. We remind all companies that enter our site of the local speed limits and expectations. We also remind all visitors to BRRP that we reserve the right to determine who is allowed onto our site.

A redevelopment plan is due to be submitted by September 2014 for the future use of the park.

Linda Stewart (Community Board): We could have a world class wildlife reserve on the site which would be a great legacy and still have the forest.

Lynne Pettit (resident): There is a big increase in the use of the new track.

Rob Pettit (resident): The new track channel's people to the weigh bridge, we should try to guide people away from the weigh bridge.

Denis Preston (CCC): I will speak to City Care about this issue.
